

Spotlight on MissionS

2018 was an exciting year for missions at Fruit Cove as teams traveled to two places never visited by our church: Montreal and London. Under the leadership of our Missions pastor, Jonathan Wilson, our church sent out mission teams to many different places on the globe, opening the eyes and hearts of the volunteers to the people groups who need to hear the Good News, some for the first time!

The MOVE weekend Oct. 22-23 introduced our church family to the many places we are serving. Creating a prayer walk and displays of countries visited, plus hearing pastors from the mission cities and towns we served. They wanted to convey their gratitude, but also impress upon our membership that there are still needs waiting to be fulfilled by next year's teams.

Christ placed a call on every single believer: "Go therefore into all the world and teach all nations; baptize them in the Name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Teach them to observe all that I have commanded you, and remember, I am with you always, even to the end of the world." Matthew 28: 19-20. He also said, before He ascended, "But you shall receive **power** when the Holy Spirit has come upon you and you shall be my **witnesses** in Jerusalem, in all Judea, and Samaria, and to the very ends of the earth." Acts 1:8.

A few years back, missionaries referred to the "10-40 window." They were referring to the latitude and longitude on the earth's surface in which a majority of unreached people groups resided. Reading current newsletters and magazines from mission organizations, this window has narrowed, not because the unreached people groups have been won to the kingdom, but because the darkness has invaded these groups so prolifically, the Christian "army" finds it difficult to invade the darkness significantly. Realistically, keeping missionaries in the "window" boils down to dollars and cents. That is where the Lottie Moon Christmas offering enters the "window". Every cent we give goes to those missionaries needing our support. Please give generously and add to that: **praying every single day** that those families and individuals who answered the call will be encouraged, kept healthy and marriages stay vibrant. Try to imagine the obstacles they face daily and your struggles will pale in comparison. Giving generously and praying daily will change your focus and purpose, introducing joy and peace into the daily rhythm of life on this side.




Esther Mondays Beginning Feb. 25, 2019




Ten Women of the Bible Tuesdays Beginning Jan. 22, 2019


God of Creation

Getting to Know...Lisa Sheffield



If you have called the church office for any reason concerning our SportsLife ministry, you have more than likely talked with Lisa Sheffield, so this is your chance to get to know her a little better.

Lisa was born in Jacksonville and was #6 of the 7 children born to her parents. When Lisa was 4 years old, her parents divorced. Lisa's mom, Jackie, worked at the Thompson House (now BB's), and life changed when a kind, caring man named Joe Davis spotted the attractive waitress working there. He went in every day to buy coffee, just to get to see her. The fact that she had 7 children, did not alarm him! They married and added another child to the mix! Lisa graduated from Sandalwood High and met her husband, Mike on a blind date set up by a mutual friend. They dated for one year and married in 1986. They have 2 sons, Brandon & Ben, and a daughter, Traci. Lisa had grown up in Baymeadows Baptist Church and joined the church at an early age, but during a revival led by Rev. Bailey Smith at Southside Estates in 1987, both she and her husband, Mike were saved. Both Mike and Lisa have

served in many capacities in their church life. Mike was ordained a deacon at San Jose Baptist and has taught adult Sunday School classes for years. Lisa's heart has always been with children and has taught Sunday School and for the last several years has been a teacher in GA's, our mission program for girls. In fact, she and Angie Young began teaching together and over 5 years ago began teaching a particular group of young 1st graders, they have promoted this group every year and are now teaching these same girls—now 5th graders!

Lisa worked at American Federal Savings & Loan before beginning work in the church office at Southside Estates, where she worked for 7 years. She was a stay at home mom for 17 years. Mike & Lisa joined Fruit Cove in 2004, and she began working in the church office as the administrative assistant to Mark Neal, our first SportsLife pastor, and she is now the Admin to our SportsLife pastor, Neil Muniz. As you know, our SportsLife Ministry brings many unchurched families to our campus all year long. Whether it is for the Spring Festival and Car Show, Uncle Ken's Fishing Tournament or through Upward Sports—the Gospel is proclaimed and often, families connect with Fruit Cove as their new church home.

Lisa's mom and dad have been constant examples of faith, teaching Lisa that no matter the circumstance, God is there—even in the darkest time! Lisa's family home burned when she was 12—losing everything—except her mom's Bible and a New Testament! She still has this Bible and treasures the reminder of God's faithfulness and that His Word endures forever! Her brother became a quadriplegic in a horse accident and was cared for by their parents for 20 years until his death less than 2 years ago. Again, Lisa witnessed the power of faith and strength in her parents, even in the hardest of circumstances. The sudden death of her brother was soon followed by the illness and death of her best friend—her mom. Though this past couple of years has been very difficult for Lisa, she relies on her faith, and she knows where her brother & mom are! This brings the peace that passes all understanding and comfort found only in Him. She is now attending Grief Share, and says that she "didn't realize how much I needed it, and as difficult as it is, knows it is a necessary part of healing."

When not working at Fruit Cove, Lisa's greatest joy is spending time with her family. She loves photography, riding her bike, traveling, cruises, and yes...She loves Disney and Mustangs—the four wheel kind!

If you have a chance to meet Lisa, stop and say "Hello", and of course...she is always needing volunteers in SportsLife!



Crystallized Orange Nuts

1/4 cup orange juice

1 cup sugar

2 cups pecan halves

Combine sugar and orange juice in a 12x7, 12x8 or 9" glass baking dish and stir well with a wooden spoon. Stir in pecans. Microwave for 6 minutes at medium-high (60% power) with the turntable off. Stir and then continue cooking for another 6-7 minutes on medium-high (60% power).

Remove dish from microwave and stir pecans until sugar starts to crystallize.

Spread nuts in a single layer on a greased cookie sheet to cool.

Store in a tightly covered container.
